The following tasting notes are for the beers we hope to be able to showcase this weekend, and are listed in no particular order. Their availability will depend on how much beer we sell/casks we have to change! Not all of these beers will be available at all times on both days.

FYNE ALES – SCOTLAND

Avalanche 4.5% pale ale – A delicious dry, straw coloured ale with a fragrant lemon foretaste & an intriguing hint of grapefruit to finish. Multiple award winning beer, always a Coach favourite.

Vital Spark 4.4% dark ale – Rich & full bodied with a dry finish. Vital Spark glows darkly with a glimmer of red. International Beer Challenge, Best Stout & Porter 2010.

Highlander 4.8% traditional bitter A fine strong ale with traditional character. Full of malt flavours with hops contributing a lovely citrus aroma. International Beer Challenge, Best Ale, 2009 AND 2010!

Pipers Gold 3.8% pale ale – A bitter pale ale, golden in colour, with a long dry finish. CAMRA Champion Beer of Britain Bronze Medallist 2008

Innishail 3.6% golden ale Starts with a citrus floral aroma, honey on the pallet & a bold grapefruity finish.

Hurricane Jack 4.4% pale ale – Pale gold, grassy hop aroma with some delicate hints of spice & a floral touch. Big citrus and some faint resinous notes. Grassy, hoppy, delicious.

Jarl 4.5% pale ale – Light, bright pine & citrus hop hit on the nose. Soft mellow malts on the pallet, along with a lemon hop character. A full on citrus experience. A perfect ale for whiling away the hours on a sunny day.

BREWDOG) SCOTLAND

Sam Saint 5% red ale Lots of hops added late and plenty of dry hops, to quote The Dogs themselves... 'Once this ruby liquid forms a foamy halo around your glass, you will never want to look back.'

Punk IPA 6% This 6% trans-atlantic fusion IPA is light golden in colour with tropical fruits and light caramel on the nose. The palate soon becomes assertive and resinous with the New Zealand hops balanced by the biscuit malt. The finish is aggressive and dry with the hops emerging over the warming alcohol.

Trashy Blonde 4.1% pale ale – Pale ale with plenty of passionfruit hop character & balancing malty body.

Hardcore IPA 9.2% ALL the hops, ALL the bitterness, laid out on a backdrop of toffee malt. World Beer Cup Gold Medallist Imperial IPA Category 2010

WILLIAMS BROTHERS BREWING) SCOTLAND

Joker IPA 5% A complex blend of malt & hops give a fresh & punchy citrus hop with a bitter sweet full flavour. Astringent, refreshing & clean.

Harvest Sun 3.9% golden ale – To slake the thirst of all you folk in need of well earned refreshment Williams Bros have created 'Harvest Sun': Golden in colour with a dry, crisp flavour and sweet, hoppy aroma.

7 Giraffes 5% pale ale With elderflower & lemon zest, 7G's combines an electric blend of 7 varieties of malted barley with fresh cone hops from around the world, wild elderflowers and lemon zest to create a refreshing, aromatic and moreish beer.

Fraoch 5% heather ale Brewed in Scotland since 2000 B.C. heather ale is probably the oldest style of ale still produced in the world. From an ancient Gaelic recipe for "leann fraoich" (heather ale) it has been revived and reintroduced to the Scottish culture. Into the boiling brew of malted barley, sweet gale and flowering heather are added, then after cooling slightly the hot ale is poured into a vat of fresh heather flowers where it infuses for an hour before being fermented. A light amber ale with floral peaty aroma, full malt character, a spicy herbal flavour and dry wine like finish.

Rosin 5% tayberry beer The tayberry is a cross between a raspberry and a blackberry, originally grown in the Tay valley region of Scotland.

Rosin (pronounced Rosheen) tastes of all the good things a micro-brewed beer should (malt & hops) but with a distinct, delicate fruit aroma.

Grozet 5% gooseberry beer From the Gaelic "Groseid", Since at least the 16th century Scots monks and alewives brewed indigenous drinks from cereals, wild herbs and ripe fruits. Tibbie Shiels green Grozet was immortalised by such Scots literati as Sir Walter Scott, Jas Hogg (the Ettrick shepherd) and Robert Burns who considered it a most convivial drink. Brewed with lager malt, wheat, bog myrtle, hops and meadowsweet then secondary fermented with ripe Scottish gooseberries. A pale golden beer, with a refreshing fruit aroma, clean palette, fruity wheat flavour and crisp finish.

HAWKSHEAD BREWERY) CUMBRIA

Hawkshead Bitter 3.7% pale ale A pale, hoppy and bitter ale: a slight elderflower aroma from Slovenian "Celeia" hops, followed by long bitterness.

Hawkshead Red 4.4% red ale Bitter-sweet. First comes the sweetness of the dark crystal malt, which gives it the red colour, and then the long dry finish. A beer for those who like their ale to have some colour and taste of malt.

Organic Stout 4.5% It's Organic, and, it is a soft water stout -- no water treatment is used, the soft Lakeland water has not been hardened or "Burtonised."

Cask Lager 5% This is, as you would expect, pale, with restrained but fresh hop character from European lager hops. Lager malt has been used, but the rules broken by using ale not lager yeast. Rarely found in cask, largely brewed for bottle.

Damson Stout 4.5% A dry Oatmeal Stout, infused with Whole Vanilla Pods and Lyth Valley Damsons. Sharp fruit and subtle vanilla come through at the finish.

ROOSTERS) NTH Yorkshire

Yorkshire PA 4.3% Silver medallist at the World Beer Cup, Chicago, 2010. Pale gold colour, with a fruity peach melba aroma, long aromatic finish, medium bitterness. Made with Golden Promise malt, soft Yorkshire water and Styrian Goldings hops. The latter making a nice change from the citrusy US hops. They have a fruit aroma that's hard to place but distinctive.

Yankee 4.3% pale ale Pale coloured premium aromatic bitter. Soft bitterness. Aromas of lychee and tropical fruit, sometimes Muscat grapes. Lingering finish. Brewed with Golden Promise malt, soft Yorkshire water and Cascade hops from the Yakima Valley.

Leghorn 4.3% pale ale Gold Medal, World Beer Cup, Chicago, 2010. Made with 3 aromatic hops; Chinook, Crystal and Cascade. Tropical fruit/floral aromas. Full tasting, well balanced.

Wild Mule 3.9% pale ale Flagship beer for the Outlaw Beers range, where Roosters take the opportunity to experiment on their 18 gallon brew plant. Stunning aromas of gooseberries, grapes and guava. Moderately bittered and pale in colour.

MARBLE BEERS) MANCHESTER

Pint 3.9% pale ale Originally named 'Janine's One'. A firm Coach favourite, so much flavour, belied by a relatively low ABV. Citrus, floral, delicious & refreshing. Love, love, love.

Ginger Marble 4.5% ginger beer Boozy ginger beer, what's not to love?! Don't be scared, this ginger is spicy, delicious and incredibly refreshing.

Brew 57 5.7% pale ale Big fruit and hop aroma. Golden coloured, fruity and hoppy grapefruit flavour with a hint of bitterness in a slightly creamy lasting malt finish.

Summer 4.5% Grapefruit, tangerine and pineapple citrus flavours with a delightful resinous mouth feel combine to create a memorable pint.

DARK STAR / sussex

HopHead 3.8% pale ale The name says it all... Loads of flavour, drinks like a beer with a higher ABV, get your IPA kicks without the kick!

American Pale Ale 4.7% Brewed with specially imported yeast from America, along with Cascade & Centennial hops this pale ale is all about the US of A (except the bit where it's made in the UK) Pale, aromatic, crisp & dry.

Paradise Weiss 5% wheat beer Naturally hazy, brewed with German malted wheat in addition to barley malts. The restrained bitterness is augmented by the addition of the very peppery Paradise Seeds & Curacao peel in the copper.

Best Bitter 4% Brewed as a traditional Sussex style bitter using Maris Otter, Crystal & Chocolate malts and East Kent Golding hops. As with many in the Dark Star catalogue, plenty of hops are added late to the brew for full aromatic character.

Espresso Stout 4.2% A black beer brewed with Roasted Barley malt, Challenger hops AND the addition of freshly ground coffee beans in to the copper for a few minutes after the boil, producing a rich, coffee aroma to compliment the darkness...

THORNBRIDGE) DERBYSHIRE

Jaipur 5.9% IPA Our multiple award winning India pale ale with the colour and flavour of honeycomb. Soft and smooth with loads of resinous and citrus characters. Finishes powerful, yet pleasantly bitter. Gold Medal winner at the 2008 Great British Beer Festival, and, recent recipient of a prestigious 3 Gold 'Great Taste Award' Stars!

Raven 6.6% black IPA Our first Black IPA, brewed by our newest brewer, James Kemp, New Zealand's Home brewer of the Year. Masses of ripe orange and rich, citrus and resin hop characters on the nose. Medium bodied with more pungent hop characters filling the mouth, a touch of lime zest, some dry astringency and a wonderful back palate, throat tingling bitterness. A celebration of hops in a unique "Never Ordinary" style.

Craven Silk 4% pale ale Brewed with elderflower - a golden summer ale made with a selection of American and Slovenian hops, Maris Otter Pale Ale and Crystal malts and infused with freshly picked Derbyshire elderflowers. An initial aroma of elderflower and a clean and zesty flavor. Fresh and grassy hop characters and a light, refreshing bitter finish make this beer the ideal warm weather pint. The elderflower character lingers long after swallowing.

Pollards 5% coffee milk stout A twist on the classic Milk Stout, a sweet stout style containing lactose to add body and subtle sweetness. Three separate coffee bean roasts were hand selected and added to the brew, beans intact, to give a smooth coffee character to the roasty, toasty stout. The beans were sourced from Sheffield's own craft roaster, Pollards. Initially sweet, with coffee bean apparent in the mouth and lingering bittersweet finish.

The Light 2.9% pale mild Golden orange in colour with a delightful, clean floral nose. A hint of citrus sherbet in the aroma with delicate hoppy perfume coming through. Light caramel and water cracker characters appear in the mouth. A mass of specialty malt gives this light mild a dry mouthfeel and a clean, refreshing and wonderfully crisp finish.

Lumford 3.9% pale ale A golden colour with aromas of rich tropical fruits, ripe berries & hints of fruity cheesecake. The mouth has subtle malt characters & flavours of passionfruit & gooseberry, with a lovely clean finish.

Seaforth 5.9% English IPA This English IPA is named after the second ship to take the original IPA to India. Light copper with a nose of fruit and berries, a gentle maltiness in the mouth and a wonderful citrus, lemon-pith bitterness.

Murmansk 7.4% Baltic porter Named after the Russian World War 2 Ally city, this Baltic style Porter delivers wisps of mocha, coffee, bitter chocolate and maple walnut in the aroma. Oaty, roasted malt and dark fruit flavours follow, along with buckets of sweetness, alcoholic warmth and a delayed, rich after-bitterness.

Hopton 4.3% English pale ale A burnt gold English Pale Ale brewed with Pioneer & Bramling Cross hops. Some malt present in the nose with a hint of lime & lemon peel. Medium bodied with some biscuit character & more citrus present in the mouth. The finish shows a clean bitterness with a touch of lingering grassiness.

Lord Marples 4% best bitter A traditional British bitter, full of caramel and light toffee flavours with a smooth mouthfeel. All English hops provide a mix of floral and spicy characters, evident on the nose and the palate. A fabulous bitter finish makes this a classic. National SIBA Champion - Bitters & Pale Ales Category 2010 and Bronze Medal winner in the Best Bitter Category of the Champion Beer of Britain 2009 competition.

Wild Swan 3.5% pale ale A white golden colour ale with light lemon zest aromas and a subtle herbal character. Hints of nettle and citrus with a touch of biscuit in the swallow. A lingering bitter finish leaves you anticipating the next mouthful...
